And the Angels Were Silent: the Final Week of Jesus, by Max Lucado. "It's early in the final week. The props and players for Friday's drama are in position...Only this is no play, it's a divine plan...and now all heaven waits and watches. All eyes are on one figure, the Nazarene...Leaving Jericho and walking toward Jerusalem...He is on a journey, His final journey. Even the angels are silent. They know this is no ordinary walk. They know this is no ordinary week. For hinged on this week is the door of eternity." Walk through the week with Max Lucado as he examines how Jesus spent His final days.

Jesus Touched Them, is a lovely book published by Ideals. "Countless writers and artists have been moved by the stories of Jesus' love and power. In poetry, fiction, essays, sermons, drawings, and paintings, these men and women have given faces and personalities to the disparate group of people who knew Jesus first hand, and whose lives were transformed by His presence." This book offers something for everyone.

## Helping Hands

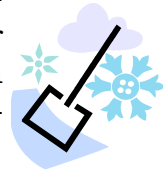

## Confirmation Class

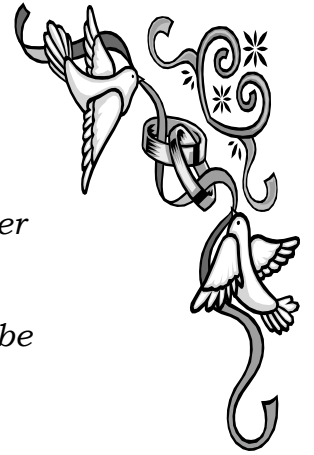

## **Year 2009 Financial Results**

Due to the uncertain condition of our economy through 2009, we sustained a loss of \$16,768 in our general operations of the church. This was only the second year in the last nine years that this has happened. It was not caused by overspending. In fact, through prudent spending by each of our programs, and constant oversight throughout the year by the Administrative Committee and Session, we actually spent \$15,300 less than our budget, even though unforeseen increases in several items occurred.

Unfortunately, we only received \$155,818 of the \$186,824 pledged, thus a deficit of \$31,006 from our anticipated amount in the budget.

We understand how and why this happened. Fortunately, due to surpluses accumulated from prior years, we are still in a healthy and sound financial position. It is our hope that conditions will improve throughout 2010, and we may end this year with at least a balanced budget. Your cooperation and support are greatly appreciated.
