The children and parents will have the opportunity to see their classrooms, and to meet their teachers for the new school year. At the 11:00 service, all Sunday School students will be recognized, and some will be promoted to the next grade level. All Sunday School teachers will be dedicated at the 11:00 service.

New Year Begins for Sunday School

All Sunday School classes will begin their new year on September 19. If you have not attended Sunday School before, we encourage you to do so. We have classes for everyone from toddlers to adults. Details on all the classes can be found below.

Student Classes

All students meet in the sanctuary from 9:45-10:00 a.m. for an opening program. During this time, we recite the pledge to the Bible and to the Christian flag. We have a brief devotion, and announcements are made. An offering is taken up before the children head off to their classes. Half of the offering goes back to the church, and the other half goes to sponsor our “adopted” child, Ramesh, from India. Our sponsorship is through the organization, Compassion International. At 10:00 a.m., the students are dismissed to their Sunday School classes. David C. Cook is the curriculum used for all student classes. Parents/grandparents, please pick your children up from their classes at 10:45 a.m. if they are in 1st grade or below.

- **Toddler Class:** This class is for our youngest students. Melody Paul is the teacher. The class is located downstairs, at the bottom of the stairs, on the left hand side.
- **Preschool Class:** This class is located downstairs, at the bottom of the stairs, on the right hand side. This class is taught by Libby Llewellyn and Jennifer Metz.
- **Kindergarten/1st Grade:** The class is located in the room across from the downstairs kitchen. Tracy McLane and Ann Mason are the teachers.
- **2nd/3rd Grade:** The 2nd/3rd grade class is located downstairs, in the main fellowship hall, on the right side. Carol Erck is the teacher for this class.
- **4th/5th Grade:** This class meets in the new area downstairs. The room is located on the left side. Hank and Joey Hemphill are the teachers.
- **6th-8th Grade:** This class meets in the new area downstairs, on the right side. Tammy Coyle and Wendy LaTorre are the teachers.
- **9th-12th Grade:** The teens meet in the room across from the Legacy Conference Room, upstairs. Carolyn Hetzer is the teacher.

Adult Classes

The three adult classes meet from 9:45-10:30 a.m. each Sunday morning. Find a class that’s just right for you.

- **Mac McCauley Class:** This class is located in the Adult Library, off the Friendship Hall. Eric Arvidson is the teacher. The class uses the Presbyterian Curriculum, The Present Word, as their study guide. This fall, they will begin a new study entitled, The Inescapable God: God Reveals, God Sustains, and God Protects.
- **Voyager Class:** This class meets in the room right before entering the Friendship Hall, on the right side. Different class members act as facilitators. The class chooses the curriculum that will be studied. Currently, they are studying the book by Max Lucado, He Still Moves Stones.
- **Seeker Class:** This class, taught by Pastor Mark, meets in the Legacy Conference Room. They are beginning to study Ephesians.



Other Worship Opportunities for Children

- **Kids of the Kingdom:** Kids of the Kingdom is offered both during the 8:30 and 11:00 services. Kids of the Kingdom is designed for children from Kindergarten through 5th grade. The children remain in the sanctuary until after the children's sermon. At that time, they are escorted downstairs for a Bible story, craft, and snack. Parents, please pick up your children immediately after the church service.
- **T.O.T.s (Toddlers of the Throne):** T.O.T.s is offered during the 11:00 service for those too old for the nursery and still a little too young to sit through the worship service. During this time, children will hear a Bible story, do a simple craft, and have a snack. Parents, please pick up your children right after the 11:00 service. If you plan on using the T.O.T.s program for the 2010-2011 year, please see Annette so that she can get your child's information.
- **Little Angel Nursery:** We have a nursery available to our littlest ones. The nursery is located downstairs, in the first room on the right hand side. Melody Paul is our Nursery Coordinator. Please fill out an information card on your child for the 2010-2011 school year.

Children's Bulletins

There are two sets of children's bulletins on the table in the back of the sanctuary. One set is designed for children ages 3-6, the other set is geared for children ages 7-12. Help yourself to an age appropriate bulletin before sitting down to worship.

Featured Teachers

Each month, we would like to feature two Sunday School teachers. We are so appreciative of their ministry of teaching God's Word to our students of all ages. You may not always get a chance to visit with these folks on a Sunday morning because they are busy teaching. Here's a chance for you to get to know these unsung heroes a little better. This month, we will be featuring two teachers who run the age spectrum in the area of teaching—Eric Arvidson, one of our adult teachers, and Melody Paul, our toddler teacher.

Eric Arvidson has been teaching Sunday School for 14 years, the longest of any of our current teachers. That in itself is a great accomplishment! The best part of teaching for Eric is being a conduit for understanding God's Word. The Gospel of Mark is Eric's favorite book, and the story of Christ calming the storm is his favorite story. The Scripture, "*I will never leave you nor forsake you*", is Eric's favorite Scripture. One of Eric's favorite Sunday School memories was memorizing Psalm 100.

Eric has two daughters, Emily and Diana, and a son, E.W. E.W. is an active church member who assists with Youth Group, and sings in the choir. Prime rib, New England boiled dinner, lobster, and corn are some of Eric's favorite food. Prince Edward Island is one of Eric's favorite vacation spots.

Besides teaching Sunday School, Eric is active in the church in many other areas. He is in the choir, and sings lovely solos for the worship service in the summer months. He is a member of the Presbyterian Men organization, and is a terrific help with our Living Nativity set up and parking. He is also instrumental in the Presbyterian Men's Yard Sale that is held each spring. Thank you, Eric, for faithfully serving our church in a variety of ways for so many years. What a blessing you have been to our Adult Class in teaching them each week, as well as serving our church in a variety of other ways.

Melody Paul is our Toddler Sunday School teacher, as well as our Nursery Coordinator. Melody has been teaching at St. Andrew for the last 11 years. The best part of teaching for Melody is watching young children learn about God, and begin to answer questions about God. Her favorite Bible stories are the Creation story, Noah's Ark, and Jesus' birth. Her favorite Scripture is Isaiah 53:4-8, *"Surely He has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted Him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon Him was the punishment that made us whole, and by His bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He did not open His mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so He did not open His mouth. By a perversion of justice He was taken away. Who could have imagined His future? For He was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people."* Singing songs and reading Bible stories are favorite memories of Sunday School when Melody was a child.

Melody has a husband of 18 years, Nathan. She has 5 children—Danielle, Matthew, Lorraine, Destin, and Claude; and 2 grandchildren—Emerson and Wyatt. Melody's favorite food is any type of seafood. Reading and going to the ocean are favorite activities of Melody's.

We have been so blessed to have watched Melody's children attend Sunday School weekly here at St. Andrew. Melody faithfully brings her children each week. The Perfect Attendance Awards are given to Melody's children just about every month. It has been so much fun watching Melody's children grow up through the Sunday School program. Thank you, Melody, for your faithfulness in teaching our youngest students the love of Jesus for all these years, and for making Sunday School a priority for your children.

Pakistan Updates

Dear Friends,

On behalf of the children served by the Presbyterian Education Board (PEB) in Pakistan, thank you for your continued support. Your gift will be used to help provide critically needed scholarships for young girls at one of the PEB schools. Because of your help, village children will now be able to experience learning in an atmosphere of respect, where Christian teachers treat each student as a child of God.

This has been a year of great accomplishments for our students, with outstanding exam results, as well as many enrichment activities. Improved library facilities, greater use of computers, a science competition of student-developed projects, and improved support of teaching of math are among the highlights of the year...

We all worried a great deal when learning of the violence against schools in Pakistan in October, but for PEB schools, this became a time of strong community support. The one incident of violence by fundamentalists against the school in Pasrur was stopped by the police, persons were arrested, and security is now provided by the government.

With the teachers' training workshop in the summer, and follow-up training opportunities during the year, the PEB teachers are improving their skills each year, and continuing to improve the standards in the PEB schools. New ideas and teaching materials help provide the students with skill needed to become contributing members of society...

Thank you for your continued support of this vital Christian witness.

Grocery Cards

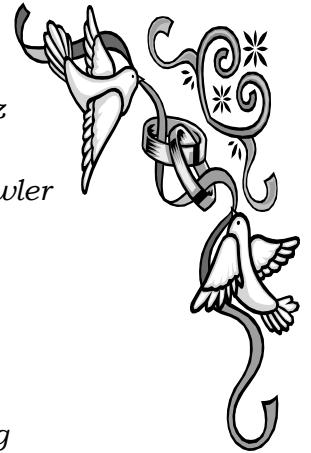
